

Hiplok AX1000

'Serious protection'

Hiplok's AX1000 ground anchor isn't cheap, especially when lesser-specced competitors can be had for a tenner. But pair it with a robust lock, such as Hiplok's own DX1000, and you've got a seriously tough setup. Undesirable types with angle grinders will require multiple cutting discs to render the AX1000 defeated. Lesser equipment, such as hammers, hacksaws, or bolt cutters, will leave them scurrying away empty-handed.

The AX1000 features a rotating base, secured by eight expanding M10 bolts. Mounted to that is a steel arm with a Ferosafe core offering a further 180° of lateral adjustability.

The arm itself features a 37x63mm loop and is 25mm thick, 70mm wide by 300mm long (to the centre of the loop) – loop clearance happens to be just right for housing a DX1000, almost like they intended the two to be used in unison.

Installation is a doddle, provided your drill has some poke. Hiplok provide a nifty paper template and a masonry drill bit, which makes the task that much simpler still. Once the base is in place, the rest of the assembly process simply requires following the instructions.
